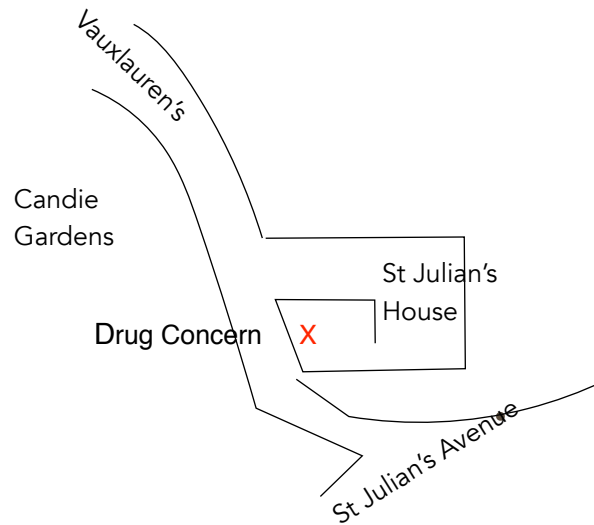

SERVICES

Drug Concern is a charity which provides services for those affected by drug or alcohol use.

We provide a counselling service for drug or alcohol users. We will work with people where they are regardless of whether they choose abstinence or general support.

Our peer support group works with families and partners of substances users, helping them make sense of how addiction affects the whole family and to find support for themselves.

We provide a program for the whole family (Moving Parents and Children Together) to help children and young people between the ages of 8 - 17, to make sense of parental drug or alcohol use and to help the parents understand how children need to make sense of addiction as a way of coping.

We operate a needle exchange service for injecting drug users and provide safe injecting advice and access to other services that may be of help to injecting drug users.

Telephone support line

The telephone support line is generally between the hours of 9am - 4pm Monday to Friday. If workers are with clients an answer machine will be available for you to leave your contact details and a worker will respond as soon as they are available.

Talking therapies

To arrange an appointment with a substance practitioner please call the office. Appointments last 45 minutes to an hour and are available during the day and early evening.

If you are seeking support for someone else's substance use this will be an informative and supportive session. If you are seeking help as a user of substances you will have an initial assessment to determine whether we are the best organisation to meet your needs. Assessment focuses on current and historical use, day-to day routine and relationships, health, and the reasons you are seeking help at this time.

PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCE

Drug Concern is a member of the Federation of Drug and Alcohol Professionals (FDAP) the professional body for the substance use field.

Drug Concern staff comply with the FDAP professional standards and work to the FDAP code of practice.
